Reformation of 601(County of London) Sqn RAuxAF. 601 (County of London) Sqn RAuxAF has been reformed under the command of ACAS as a specialist Sqn in support of CAS and his leadership of the RAF. Its three principle roles are: to provide advice to CAS and the SLT, to provide access to new networks and to develop advocates for the RAF. The Air Force Board Executive has agreed to reform the unit as a new hybrid Sqn to provide closer and more formalised links between the wider professional community and the RAF. Sqn members will provide expertise in areas from outside the RAF and will offer a fresh perspective to hone and improve the RAF's thinking.

EQUIPMENT AND MANPOWER

Aircraft Carrier Jetty Refurbished and re-Named – Her Royal Highness the Princess Royal officially named the recently refurbished Jetty which will house the two new aircraft carriers "The Princess Royal Jetty". She commented that the Queen Elizabeth class carriers, together with our F-35 jets, will transform our ability to project power around the world.

F35 The US Air Force has sent several of its F35 fighters to the UK as part of an initiative to reassure Europe in the face of Russian aggression. A handful of F-35A jets from Hill Air Force Base in Utah landed at RAF Lakenheath over the weekend for what the Pentagon said would be several weeks of training with other US and Nato military aircraft. The deployment would allow the US Air Force to "further demonstrate the operational capabilities" of the stealthy fighter jet, the Pentagon said.

A400M visit to New Zealand. The ATLAS A4000M visited New Zealand as part of its visit to Australasia and made its debut appearance at the RNZAF 2017 air tattoo. Discussing Atlas, Air Chief Marshal Hillier said: "It's a fantastic capability for the RAF, showing our ability to deploy all the way from the UK to the other side of the world. The New Zealanders were suitably impressed and envious!
