Dear Member

1. Well that was a busy year – the 100th Anniversary of the Royal Air Force and the 75th Anniversary of the Royal Air Forces Association - there were parades and events across the Country, across the County and across Shrewsbury and District. I do hope that you managed to attend or witness at least one of the events during the year. As usual I indicate below the activities that involved your Branch during 2018, but outside of that we need to thank our Branch Standard Bearer, Shawn Marston, who I am sure that you recall was elected as the Wales, Midland and South Western Area, and then National Standard Bearer. He was not always carrying our Standard (having 3 to chose from), but he has had a very busy 2018 representing the Association at many high profile national events; and we are very proud that a member of our Branch has risen to such a high profile position, and as a result he has many interesting tales to tell. Mind you with Shawn away a lot, attendance at many local events fell to our Deputy Standard Bearer Eric Blackie, who has also had a busy year. Well done to them both.

2. So what else have we done? During the year we made a further donation to the RAF Shawbury Contact Houses to enable them to obtain some play equipment for the house gardens; partly in response the Station invited members to attend a BBQ at RAF Shawbury in May which was much enjoyed by those who attended. At the same time we made a donation to the Midland Area Welfare Fund. Both these donations are visible manifestations of the work carried out by our Honorary Welfare Officers who have both had a very busy year providing assistance to those in need. The nature of their work requires confidentiality so they are unable to 'shout' about what they do, but your Committee is well aware of the outstanding support that they have provided through the year. Our thanks to both Paul and Iain.

To continue to provide the Welfare service we do, of course, need to raise money through the Wings Appeal; and Alex Madeley our redoubtable Wings Appeal Organiser has had a great year coordinating collections during 2018 that exceeded five thousand pounds, our highest total for a number of years. Alex is standing down at the end of 2018 after 9 very busy years as our Appeal organiser, our thanks to Alex.

Another issue that is running through the Association at the moment is the need to ensure that Branch Committee members are provided with appropriate training to enable them to meet the increasing legal requirements associated with running a charity, and I can report that your committee has attended the required training. The Chairman has also been involved with the Shropshire Armed Forces Covenant Group to ensure that our voice is heard as this important initiative moves forward, please speak with the Chairman if you have any views on the effectiveness of the Covenant.

5. April again saw Branch members and cadets from 1119 (Shrewsbury) Sqn RAFAC attending the annual memorial service to the fallen at the Shrewsbury War Graves, our thanks to those who attended. In May some members attended a Wales Midland and South Western Area event at Worcester Cathedral to mark the RAF's 100th Anniversary. We also ran a coach to take a number of members to the National Memorial Arboretum for the Association's big memorial event to mark the 100th Anniversary; the sun shone, the provided tea and cakes was most enjoyable, and the event itself very moving. In June we participated in the Mayor's Service to mark the change of incumbent, and then at the end of July we held a great event in Shrewsbury Town Square to mark the arrival of



the Wales Midland and South Western Area 100th Anniversary Token as it passed around the Area's Branches. It was delivered to us by the Wrekin/Wellington Branch in front of a large crowd of well wishers; we had the Mobile Exhibition Trailer in attendance which made a big impact and enabled us to raise quite a good sum for Wings, and also to recruit some new members – including the Shrewsbury Mayor and MP! Whilst the Token, and Area spotlight was on us at the beginning of August, we held a 100th Anniversary Lunch at the Wroxeter Hotel before passing the Token on to the Ellesmere Branch at an event in Ellesmere. In September members participated in RAF Shawbury's 100th Anniversary parade and memorial service at St Chad's, and later in the month back at St Chad's for the Annual Battle of Britain Service. During September the Branch also provided assistance to RAF Shawbury for their 10K Airfield Run. November brought the Remembrance Day Parade and Service which, this year was very well attended, and many members of the public turned out to mark and support the event. Our President attended a Service at Shrewsbury School to remember one of their past pupils, Edwin Pugh who was killed at the very end of WWI; you may have noticed his memorial plaque on the wall of the School Boathouse. Then at the end of November our Standard was paraded with pride and aplomb by Eric Blackie in front of 20,000 spectators at the Birmingham International Tattoo. The diary for 2019 is already filling up so please keep an eye on our excellent Web Site where you will always find up to date details of upcoming events.

I am personally very grateful to all of you who are able to support these activities and other events during the year.

We are fortunate to continue to benefit from strong support from RAF Shawbury and in particular our hardworking RAFALOs. We have also had very kind and enthusiastic support from our Town Council and local politicians with both the Mayor and Shrewsbury and Atcham MP joining our Branch this year, welcome to both of you and we would be delighted if you are able to join us at one of our social meetings.

Sadly, it has been another year where we have lost some old friends who will be missed but we have been fortunate in gaining some new members who support our meetings and to you I say welcome and I hope that you enjoy your time with us.

Finally, I pass my thanks to all the Committee members who work hard throughout the year on our behalf and I wish them and you and your loved ones a peaceful and Happy Christmas and New Year.

It is reassuring to note, in addition, that money raised by the smaller local supporting businesses has continued to contribute around 6% of the final total.

Particularly welcome this year was the offer of a free stand at the Shrewsbury Flower Show and we are hopeful this might prove a more permanent offer. If the weather had been kinder we might have had two very successful days there, instead of one! Our event in the Square was well supported by Mike Logue in his Met van and our RAFALO Sqn Ldr Gary James. The RAF Shawbury Families' Day also added to our total.

Roy and I have been extremely grateful for the support of our committee who have not only stepped in on so many occasions when collecting slots have needed filling but also helped in many other practical ways. Our thanks must also go to our regular collectors, without whose support we would not have been able to fulfil all of the collecting opportunities offered to us by the stores.

Among the other many jobs that already keep him busy, Paul Sharp has kindly offered to take over the Wings Appeal for 2019. Please don't forget, if you can't go out to collect, there are other ways you might be able to help: by asking your local newsagent or independent business if they would like to keep a RAFA tin on the counter, by having a home collecting box or two in your own hallway for visitors to drop in some change. There is also, of course, the Brew for the Few – an opportunity to get together with friends in your own home over tea and cake and raise funds for Wings at the same time.
