ANNUAL ROUND-UP

- 1. Covid continues to impact the activities of the Branch with changing guidance from the Government (and as I write further concern over the Omicron variant); however the Committee liaised throughout 2021 to ensure that the Branch kept abreast of the Association's governance requirements, provided support and welfare where required and kept under consideration when it might be possible to recommence Branch meetings. With the assistance of the Harlescott Club, Branch meetings finally recommenced in September; and it was an absolute joy to welcome everyone back to well attended meetings.

We held the Branch's Annual General Meeting 'virtually' via Zoom on 1 March, of necessity it was somewhat truncated, however we managed to meet all the legal requirements, and thanks are due to all those who took part. The Branch was also sent returns and was represented at both the 'virtual' Area Conference and the 'virtual' Association Annual Conference in October. Our Chairman represented the Branch and laid wreaths at our Annual 1 April remembrance event at Shrewsbury Cemetery; at the Shrewsbury Battle of Britain commemorative event at the Quarry, and at the annual Remembrance Sunday event. It was interesting to note the massive turn out by members of the public at the Remembrance Sunday event, and we hope that some of you were in amongst the crowd. Members of the Branch also attended and supported the RAF Shawbury Families Day event where we managed to raise a few hundred pounds towards our 2021 Wings Appeal total. Collecting was severely curtailed due to Covid restrictions so that income was most welcome.

Covid has presented a number of challenges to us all through 2021; and I fear that it may not be over yet; however your Branch has remained as active as possible, and through the year have continued to provide welfare support to those in need, collected some funds towards the Wings Appeal, and managed to welcome many of you back to our Branch meetings when they recommenced in September. Through this somewhat 'bumpy' year the Committee has been grateful to our Branch Chairman for his pragmatic and excellent leadership; thank you Paul.

The Membership fees from 1 January 2022 are:

Ordinary: £24.50, Ordinary 4-Year: £92.00,

Associate: £17.00 (Non-Air Mail: £13.00). Associate 4-Year: £66.00 (Non-Air Mail: £52.00 (Please note that, if you're paying for a 4-year membership, to continue to benefit from the reduction in membership fees you must renew your 4-year membership <u>before</u> it runs out).

Unfortunately, the Covid-19 pandemic had severely curtailed our social activities. Nevertheless, this brought out the best in our membership who willingly telephone-befriended others and also helped in other ways with social inclusion, such as shopping.

We have now returned to our normal activities, and we are most pleased to be able to re-invigorate our monthly meetings at the Harlescott Social Club, <u>17-43 Roselyn, Shrewsbury, SY1 4LP</u>. We plan to continue to meet there on the 1st (non-holiday) Monday of every month. WELFARE

11. The Welfare Officer writes:

Our Branch's welfare work has continued during the last year; however, RAFA has not permitted face-to-face meetings and all the welfare work has had to be conducted over the telephone or by email. Clearly this has not been as effective as personal contact with people requesting assistance; nevertheless, much good work has been completed.

Our RAFA Welfare Region West (WRW) team at Weston-Super-Mare has been busy, working mainly from home, maintaining RAFA's welfare commitments in difficult circumstances.

Making payments from our welfare accounts to welfare beneficiaries has become more difficult as it is not recommended to handle cash and it may be difficult for recipients to pay cheques into their bank accounts. WRW has been able to help by paying awards directly into recipients' bank accounts by bank transfer.

Normal befriending has been overtaken by telephone befriending. Not only have our Branch Befrienders been kept busy but, additionally, RAFA has recruited volunteer Branch members to make regular telephone calls to people who otherwise would have had little or no personal contact. Our grateful thanks go to all who worked hard to ensure that vulnerable and lonely people have been kept socially included. Sadly, those with significant hearing difficulties have largely been left-out because RAFA still prohibits face-to-face contacts.

Providing RAFA welfare during these difficult times has been challenging. Your RAFA and Branch welfare teams continue to work hard to help members of the RAF Family in times of need.
