WE WILL REMEMBER

Air Vice-Marshal David Whittaker CB MBE RAF (Ret'd)

The RAF Association is sad to report the death of Air Vice-Marshal David Whittaker.

AVM Whittaker joined the Royal Air Force as a National Serviceman in 1951 and trained as a pilot. On completion of training he spent the next ten years flying Day Fighter and Fighter/Ground Attack aircraft on squadrons in both the UK and Germany. After service with Headquarters 38 Group he spent two and a half years on the staff of Headquarters 24 Brigade in East Africa and Aden.

After commanding the Metropolitan Communications Squadron and completing the Royal Air Force Staff Course, he served as the Assistant Air Adviser to the British High Commissioner in New Delhi. A graduate of the RAF College of Air Warfare, his staff appointments included serving as the RAF Directing Staff Member at the Royal Naval Staff College, as a member of the personnel briefing staff of the Chief of Defence Staff and as Deputy Assistant Chief of Staff (Operations and Plans) at Headquarters Allied Forces Central Europe.

AVM Whittaker completed the 1980 Course at the Royal College of Defence Studies followed by two years as Senior RAF Officer Northern Ireland and Commanding Officer RAF Aldergrove. From Northern Ireland he went to Ottawa for three years as Air and Defence Adviser to the British High Commissioner and Head of the British Defence Liaison Staff in Canada. AVM Whittaker was awarded the MBE in 1966 and CB in 1988. His final appointment before retiring in April 1989 was Air Officer Administration and Air Officer Commanding Directly Administered Units at RAF Support Command.

Since retirement AVM Whittaker has devoted much of his time to RAF charities. He became a Life Member of the Larne Branch of the Royal Air Forces Association in January 1983 and has been Branch President from April 1983 to date. He was elected to Council in 1990, has been a member of the Executive Committee from 1992 to date and served as Vice-Chairman from 1993 to 1997. In addition, he served on the Appeals Sub-Committee from 1992 to 1993, the Welfare Advisory Committee from 1993 to 1995 and has been Chairman of the Membership Advisory Committee from 1997 to date. He served as Vice-Chairman of Council from 1999 to 2001 and was elected Chairman of Council in October 2001. He was elected a Vice President of the Association in 2000. AVM Whittaker was President of the Northern Ireland Area from 1987 until 2005, before becoming President of the Scotland and Northern Ireland Area. Apart from his duties with the Association, AVM Whittaker is the Honorary County Representative for Yorkshire for the RAF Benevolent Fund. Our thoughts are with AVM Whittaker's family and friends.



ELECTIONS TO AREA COUNCIL 2017-2019

Resolution No.3 at Annual Conference 2010 resolved that the tenure of office for Officers, Vice-Presidents and Elected Members of Area Councils be increased from one to two years, commencing with the 2011 elections. Nominations are now sought for election to Area Council in 2017 to serve until 2019.

Nomination forms have already gone out to Branch Secretaries under cover of an Area Director letter dated 18 October 2016. Anyone wishing to serve as an Area Councillor will need to be nominated by their Branch. Branches may nominate up to two members to serve on Area Council. If you are interested in taking an active role on Area Council then please contact your Branch Secretary and return a nomination to the Exeter Office by no later than 16 December 2016, or give the Exeter Office a call to discuss.

Those nominated for election to the Council will need to produce a short CV of no more than 200 words which can be distributed to Branches as part of the ballot process.

Following the decisions of Annual Conference 2016, from 1 January 2017 a number of changes will occur to the membership criteria. These are subject to the Privy Council's final approval, which we expect to receive before the end of the year. However, we need to plan for these changes and remind all members and branch Chairmen of these amendments.

Cessation of Membership

The grace period for the lapsing of a membership has changed from 90 days to 30 days. See Byelaw 7 – Membership – Subscriptions.

Membership will cease if a renewal subscription is not paid within 30 days of the end of the membership period. For all members to date, the end of the 30 day period is 30 January 2017. If a member renews after that time, their membership will run to the end of the 2017 calendar year, even if they renew in December 2017. If a member does not renew until 2018, they will transfer from calendar membership to anniversary membership (see below). They will retain their original membership number.


Anniversary Memberships

Anniversary Memberships will apply to all new members who join the Association from 1 January 2017. For example, if a member joins the RAF Association on 31 August 17, their membership will be valid until 30 August 18.

Multiple Branches

A member may now be a member of as many branches, including branch committees, as they wish. Members have to nominate one primary (or home) branch. The nominated branch will receive the membership rebate. The member will only pay one membership subscription, irrespective of their membership of other branches. Members will only receive a membership card for their primary branch.

Members of a primary branch may sit on the committees of other branches. This will be reflected on the F1056s, which all branches are required to submit annually to the Association's Headquarters. The Association's membership database will record a member's primary branch only.



Check these numbers out – October has been our best recruiting month with 220 new joiners, giving us a running total of 1,457 new members in our Area this year. Thank you for your support. Our biggest growth area has been with the serving RAF and we now have more than half of the entire trained strength on board. The next task, of course, is to welcome them all and keep them enthused!

UPDATE ON VOLUNTEERING

The Volunteering Team have welcomed a further 95 volunteers to the Association in September and October alone. The recruitment of volunteers is managed by your local Area Volunteer Coordinators, whom many of you have been in touch with in recent months. Graeme Russell's details are listed below. Many of our volunteers will be supporting the work of our Branches, either directly through roles on committees or with support of Wings Appeal collections. Some of our welfare volunteers joining us this year are linking up with Branches, either as Assistant Honorary Welfare Officers or as Befrienders. We are grateful to you all for your warm welcome of all those joining the Association.

Many of our new welfare volunteers have attended the welfare seminars in October and the Area Welfare Teams have provided updates on the Befriending Service, our volunteer recruitment efforts, how the service will fit with our existing welfare offer and how everyone can support this new initiative.

We ask new volunteers if they are interested in receiving further details of membership. Of the volunteers joining us this year 112 people have asked for information on membership, having expressed an interest in becoming a member. We have passed their details to the Membership Team who have given them all the benefits of joining the Association, as well as the benefits of becoming part of their local Branch.

Please do continue to communicate with us, we enjoy speaking to you all about your Branch volunteering needs and to hear about any activities you have been undertaking.
