WITH GREAT SADNESS - We Will Remember



<u>HIGH SPIRITS, 24 JUNE 2017 – SPITFIRE HERITAGE TRUST JOINS BRITAIN'S BEST 'CLOUD</u> BARS' FOR THE WORLD'S FIRST ROLLING SKY TOAST ON ARMED FORCES DAY

As a salute to our Armed Forces the Spitfire Heritage Trust will be hosting a rolling toast to the men and women serving in our armed forces. Spitfire Heritage Gin, created by the Trust to celebrate the Spitfire; has joined three of the country's most prestigious, luxury sky-high venues with the world's first celebratory rolling-toast that will soar through the clouds in a sequence, from Liverpool to London.

The toast, presented by personnel from Number 72 Squadron, RAF, will 'domino' through each of the luxury aerial vantage points. The guest list will include VIPs and the media for this unusual event.

Liverpool is the host city for this year's Armed Forces Day. Spitfire Heritage is partnered in the toast by the city's 34th-storey "Panoramic Restaurant" for the toast's 'ignition', while Birmingham's "Marco Pierre White" Restaurant, atop the city's towering Hotel Indigo will see its "in-flight". The final flourish will be a toast, double revolution of the Coca-Cola London Eye before "touch-down".

Liverpool. As a key target the city took more bombs per head of population during WWII than any other. The soaring "Panoramic" offers unparalleled views of land, sea and sky across the city skyline and Denise France representing Spitfire Heritage will join members of Number 72 Squadron there to start the rolling-toast.

David Beaufort-Dysart, General Manager at The Panoramic, said: "The Panoramic is the ultimate vantage point sitting, as it does, commanding views over the Mersey Estuary and across the city skyline. City dwellers and commuters have daily reminders of the impact of WWII as, what is locally known as 'The Bombed out Church', was kept in its ruined state as testament to Liverpool's resilience. We look forward to the toast event."

Birmingham. The stunning "Hotel Indigo" was chosen because of its dominance of the Birmingham skyline. Sarah Hewitt of Spitfire Heritage and members of Number 72 Squadron will be among the guests atop the city that is predominantly the heart and home of the Spitfire. General Manager Julian Hook said: "We are proud to be a part of this occasion. It celebrates our Armed Forces, serving and retired, across all the *four* services and we look forward to toasting them with a quintessential British tipple."

London. The beautiful and iconic Coca-Cola London Eye offers another stunning land, sea and sky vista. Flying over the Thames it offers unparalleled views of the capital's buildings - historic and new – that serves to remind us how we owe their very existence to the efforts of our Armed Forces.

Special guests at the London finalé include immediate family of the Supermarine Spitfire's test pilot Captain Joseph 'Mutt' Summers who took the first flight in the new aircraft in March 1936. Mutt was chief test pilot for Vickers-Supermarine.

Also in the capsule for the toast will be Mrs Joy Lofthouse* one of the last remaining ATA 'girls' – the women pilots of the Air Transport Auxiliary who flew Spitfires unarmed and unescorted in dangerous skies, delivering them to front line RAF Squadrons. Now in her 90s, she still enjoys taking to the air in light aircraft. Joy will be accompanied by David Spencer Evans, Chairman and Ian Hewitt, Vice Chairman of The Spitfire Heritage Trust**

Sunny Jouhal; Coca-Cola London Eye General Manager, said: "We are proud to be taking part in this unique event to celebrate Armed Forces Day in partnership with some of the country's other sky-high landmarks. Our place in, and connection to, London's skyline makes the summit of the London Eye a perfect place to raise a glass to acknowledge our debt to those brave members of the Armed Forces, past and present who defend our freedoms."

It is fitting that the toast will be presented by members of Number 72 Squadron: the Squadron will be celebrating its own centenary just a few days later on the 27th of June with a flypast over every airfield to have been home for the squadron across the UK. The flypast event will include a press occasion at Duxford and further celebrations at the Squadron's Linton-on-Ouse base sponsored by Spitfire Heritage.

The Squadron became a dedicated Spitfire Squadron in 1941, thanks to the people of Lesotho, a small African country that raised more money per head of population than any other country in the Commonwealth – enough to build 24 Spitfires: a whole squadron with some to spare! The Spitfire Heritage Trust paid a tribute to Lesotho late last year, building and shipping out a full-size Spitfire replica which was received by H.M. The King for permanent display at the War Memorial in the capital's central square.

Spitfire Heritage Gin's strapline 'Built to be the Best'*** is borrowed from the legend of the Spitfire itself. The gin's slogan is 'it's 6 o'clock somewhere in the world Darling'.

The toast will begin at 5.50pm at The Panoramic, relayed via Hotel Indigo at 5.55pm and finish with the final toast on the rolling Coca-Cola London Eye at 6pm.

**The Spitfire Heritage Trust is supported by Spitfire Heritage Gin. The team at Spitfire Heritage Gin
helped the Trust volunteers make the Lesotho tribute possible and work on further projects, including
mountain bikes for the children of Lesotho to get to school. Lesotho is the highest country in Africa where
the tribute Spitfire now sits.

***Spitfire Heritage Gin was built to be the best, by world champion gin maker, master distiller John Walters for Spitfire Heritage Distillers. It is one of only three single estate, small batch gins in the UK and its botanicals (for an authentic 1930s gin) were chosen to commemorate the ATA Spitfire pilots. Borage (for courage), Rosemary (for remembrance), English Rose Petals (for the flowers of Britain who flew so bravely) and Blood Orange. Other botanicals include star anise, coriander and almonds.
